#### **Situation:**

Some cooling fans used in the E1401B have a problem with the fan blades hitting the inside of the fan housing. This causes an audible "clicking" noise. In many cases, the "clicking" is only apparent when the fan speed is "high". At low speed, it may not be audible. This defect has only been found in fans with plastic housings.

This problem may also be aggravated by an interference between the rear feet and the fan mounting bracket. In some cases, removing the feet will stop the noise.

## **Solution/Action:**

Replace the defective fans with fans which have metal housings.
